2020 Street Machine Nationals, St. Paul, MN CAMPING FAQ's

Q) What do I need to bring when I check-in?

Campers must bring a valid driver's license and current Street Machine Nationals exhibitor or participant credentials in order to check-in to campsite. Campers MUST PICK UP CREDENTIALS AT <u>REGISTRATION</u> or <u>EXHIBITOR CHECK-IN</u> prior to campgrounds check-in & show proof of being a registered exhibitor / participant.

Q) If I reserve a spot, do I get to choose my campsite?

No, all spots are assigned internally on a first come, first serve basis.

Q) Which campgrounds is available?

Street Machine Nationals camping is available in the Minnesota State Fairgrounds' North Campgrounds at the corner of Snelling Ave and Hoyt Ave.

Q) Do all sites have power?

Most of the sites in the north campgrounds do have power, however, some tent sites do not have power. 20 amp service is provided.

Q) Can I use a generator?

No. Generators are not permitted in the campgrounds in order to keep noise levels to a minimum.

Q) Do I need to be a registered Street Machine Nationals exhibitor or participant to camp?

YES - the campground is only open to registered Street Machine Nationals participants as well as exhibitors/vendors. Campers will be required to show event credentials before entering the campground.

Q) What time will the campgrounds gates open for the cars to directly enter the fairgrounds?

The campgrounds has a gate that allows campers to drive their show cars directly into the event starting at 6:30 am. CREDENTIALS NEEDED FOR RE-ENTRY.

Q) Is there a size limit for campers?

Yes, the North Campground has a size limitation of 35' (this size is dictated by the Minnesota State Fairgrounds).

Q) Can I park my car in my camp spot?

The campsite sizes are dictated by the fairgrounds, the campsites are assigned by the size of your camping unit. Therefore we cannot guarantee that your car will fit on any given site. We do have overflow parking for any car that will not fit in your site. Vehicle must line up with camper in the camp site. Small tent sites, depending on the arrangement, will not be allowed to park their cars with the exhaust pointing towards the tent, this is a safety issue.

Q) Can I bring my car trailer into the campgrounds?

Car trailers, cargo trailers and car dollies are not allowed in the campground.

Q) What are Camping Check-In Hours: Thursday, July 16: Noon - 6:00 pm and Friday, July 17: 8:00 am - 2:00 pm. All camping units must be in the campgrounds by 2:00 pm CT Friday.

Q) Can I park my camper on Saturday?

No, all camping units must be in the campgrounds by Friday, there will not be any campers parked after 2:00 on Friday, July 17th.
